

Both Queen Galadriel and Duet participated in the Sail Training International's Falmouth to Greenwich Tall Ships' Regatta. The race in early September was from Falmouth to St Catherine's Point on the Isle of Wight following which the international fleet of over 40 vessels, sailed in company up The Thames to Royal Greenwich. The force 4-5 westerly winds got the vessels off to a good start but the light airs in the final stages presented a

Not so for 102 year old Duet which, with some fantastic team work from the Enfield volunteer police cadets, crossed the line after 37 hours, coming first in her class and winning overall on corrected time by 13 minutes.

HRH the Countess of Wessex attended the event and Duet's crew were among sailors and young trainees to be introduced to the royal visitor. The whole experience was one they will never forget.



## **Our 2015 Season Plans**

**Queen Galadriel** - After leaving her mud berth in Maldon in April, QG will spend the spring sailing from Ipswich before heading down to the South Coast to sail from Gosport. Her voyages in general will be coastal but when the weather and sea conditions are favourable she might head across the Channel to France or the Channel Islands. We would also like QG to participate in the ASTO Small Ship Race in Cowes so call us now if you are interested.

**Faramir** - The first few months of Faramir's season will be on the East Coast from where she can easily sail to Holland or Belgium if the conditions allow. For those groups not wishing to travel so far, there will be plenty of voyages along the East and South East Coasts visiting the historic and commercial ports as well as the more isolated backwaters and bays.

**Duet** - This season Duet will be sailing mostly from the East Coast and the crew have already identified a number of Old Gaffer regattas that she could take part in as part of her normal sailing schedule for young people and any interested adult groups. She will also run her limited series of voyages suitable for students looking for an exciting residential for their Duke of Edinburgh Gold Award.

**Voyage of Discovery Fund** - Most youth groups and special needs adult groups can access our Voyage of Discovery Fund to help cover the costs of their voyage. The level of support will depend upon the group's particular needs and our success at raising money for the scheme. Feedback from groups and young people who have been supported through the fund on previous voyages is vital to this success so we are always pleased to hear from anyone who feels their voyage with Cirdan has made a difference.


